Parish Clerks Report

Wroxall Parish Council met on the 14th April. We had originally agreed to carry on with the IW Council Environment Service but for only two hours a month rather than 4. The price has doubled and the service we had received recently was just was not worth it. This could leave us in a difficult position but each and every one of us can help in a small way.

I guess the biggest bugbear is dog poo. We have erected some signs at the hot spot area by Travis Perkins and this has helped. We can buy some more signs if further areas are identified and we think the signs would help. There are plenty of dog poo bag dispensers around the village kindly supplied and replenished by Sally Page. There are plenty of dog poo bins and you can also use the ordinary litter bins as well.

If you are going to post dog poos on social media, please ensure you also spend another couple of minutes putting it on Island Roads “fix my street”, so that it gets collected. If you let the Parish Council know when you have placed it on “fix my street”, I will do my best to spray paint it so that no one else walks in it meanwhile.

The other area causing issues are the recycle bins in the carpark. Again, we are grateful to Sally Page who reports any fly tipping in this area and gets any inappropriate items picked up. Fly tipping took place on Span Down. This had to be picked up at IW Council expense.

We are getting nearer to the Garage Gallop. This is a free event to showcase our beautiful village. Hot refreshments and drinks will be available at Stenbury Hall. Please support the event by registering your drive so that it is on the map, or book a table top at Stenbury Hall. We will also have a table for local business to display their business cards to promote them. Further details are elsewhere in the magazine.

The Parish Council is going to apply for a 90 Little Book Stop, which is celebrating 90 years of Penguin books. It would enable books to be borrowed, read and returned and is stocked by Penguin.

The green volunteers have been busy around the village, tidying, planting and painting benches and steps. Our thanks to Finley, Jen, Josie and Mark Jefferies and also Roger Smith for watering the plants in the High Street. There are still jobs to be done so if you have a few spare hours, we would be delighted if you could join the volunteers.

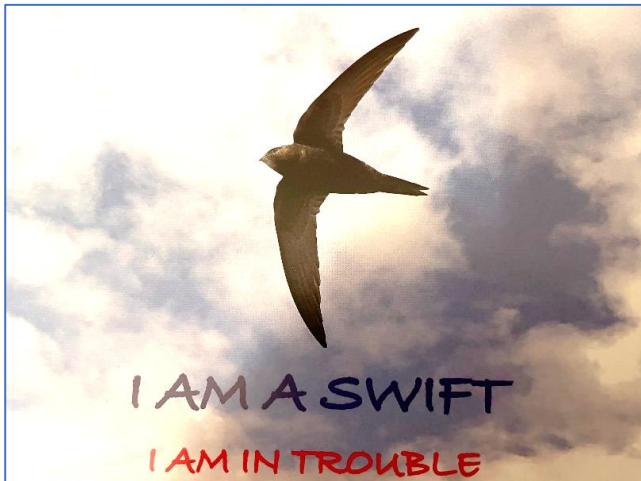

How the seasons and years change. I think this time last year the ground was very wet. This year it is so dry and the ground is hard. At the moment the grass is not growing. This impacts on making hay and silage for winter feed which could lead to a shortage. Some areas of the country have had torrential rain but very little for us. Hopefully this rain is damping down some areas which have been experiencing wildfires which sadly have resulted in animals being killed.

There was some early spring colour at the recreation ground from the daffodils planted last autumn. We are still waiting for the wildflowers to poke through. Fingers crossed. The hedging that was planted is looking good. Do take a walk up there. You won't regret it. The views are stunning and there is plenty of seating. There is an abundance of primroses in the lanes at the moment and the bluebells will be next.

There are new born lambs and calves around the farms in the village.

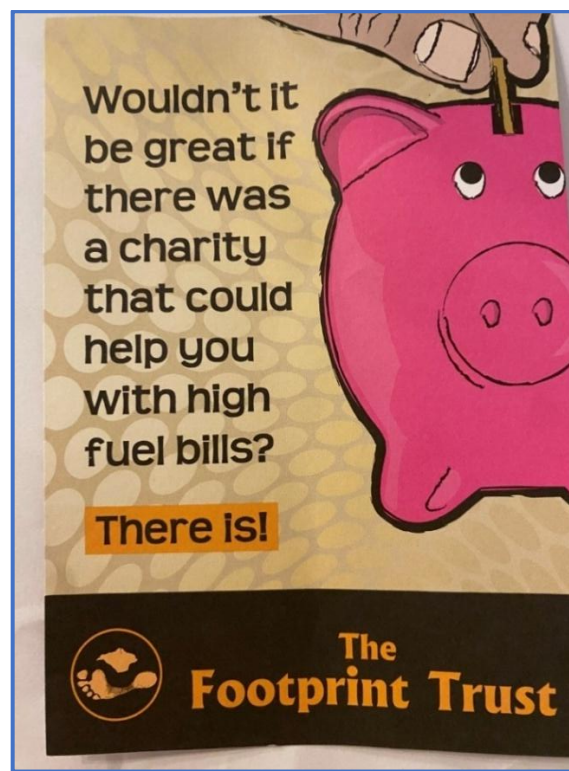
Parish Council is funding the purchase of the mugs.

Cllr Rodney Downer, IW County Councillors Annual Report

During the past year I have sat on IW Council Corporate Scrutiny Committee, Health and Adult Social Care Committee and Children's Committee. I also attended all Full Council meetings and have attended all Parish Council meetings.

This has been a particularly difficult year for Wroxall and I have made many representations about the state of the roads through the village, compounded with the two closures of Leeson Road. Which meant that the traffic increased to 8,000 vehicles movements per day as opposed to 5,000. I arranged a meeting with Island Roads to discuss these issues along with members of the Parish Council. A further meeting has been arranged with the Isle of Wight Council Highways team and this will take place in May. Works have been done in Clarence Road and St John's Road but only of a temporary nature. When the full works take place. later on in the year, a hard road closure will be necessary.

There were two lots of works at the Graben this year. One to fill in a hole which had appeared and the other works by Southern Water. I made representations to Southern Vectis about bus services to Wroxall and Upper Ventnor and a service was provided.

One sad occurrence from the Southern Water works is that the workers were subjected to verbal abuse which, I'm sure you will agree, is unacceptable. Drain covers that were rattling have been replaced in Clarence Road and the High Street.

The wooden bollards in St John's Road that were broken have been replaced. The path at the back of Stenbury View was tidied and swept after I made representations to Island Roads.

Wight Fibre – I have made representations about the reinstatement after their work in the village; some of this is still outstanding and I will keep making representations.

The old railway line had a blocked gully and this was attended to. Island Roads also did a cut of nettles and brambles. I reported a broken step on the steps going up to the railway line.

Wroxall School – I am very pleased to say that the school has been kept open. In an effort to ensure the school stayed open, I attended many meetings with

Governors, met with parents and engaged regularly with IW council officers. My thanks to the School Governors, Save Wroxall School, the Parish Council and residents, for all the support during this very trying time. Also, to Stenbury Hall and Wroxall Woolies for providing venues for meetings.

Cemetery – I made complaints about the untidiness in the Cemetery after grass cutting and contractors were brought back to rectify this.

There is still no progress with the Bothy, due to lack of money within the Isle of Wight Council being the problem. However, gravel will be supplied for the paths in the Cemetery provided by Bereavement Services. It will be laid, as before, by the Probation Service.

The trees by the road to the recreation ground have been cut back, as have the trees going up Castle Road.

Sadly, the village lost a stalwart resident this past year. Malcolm Hood. Malcolm did so much for the village community and is sorely missed.

It was humbling to lay a wreath on Remembrance Day and I am pleased that we had a very good attendance at the Church.

Thank you to Jen and Finley for their work with tidying throughout the village.

I was pleased to help sort plants for the wildflower planting at the recreation ground, organised by the Parish Council. Thanks to Jackie Gallop for organising and also to all the residents who helped with the planting.

I have tried to do my best for the village throughout the year and I thank the Parish Council for all their support.

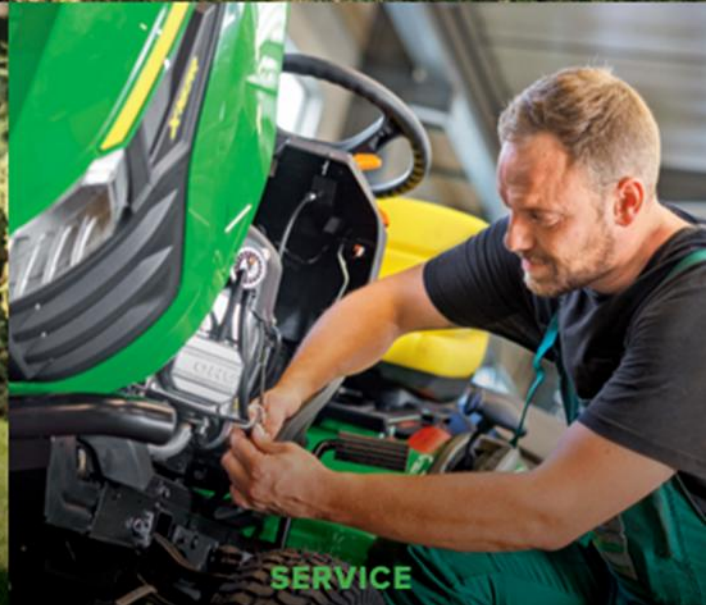

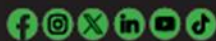
