Chairmans Report

It is delightful that we can enjoy village life in the midst of what amounts to be an unseasonably warm, early summer. Doubtless, there'll be a hose-pipe ban anytime now. The wild flowers planted last September have proved resistant to the good weather and there is little to show for the 1000s that we planted last September. When the rain finally does arrive, (probably August?) maybe the little seedlings will emerge and provide colour and fragrance.

The Parish Council are working hard to ensure that the inaugural Garage Gallop goes ahead on Sunday the 15th June with as few issues as possible. We have, I believe, about 25 households each holding their own car boot sales on their drives. Some other villages are also running their own Garage Gallop this summer, and many are making charges; ours is running at no cost to the participants at all. We are about to go to print with the 'flyers' to promote the day that will be in Stenbury Hall and the Village shop. Speaking of which, Manager Jack is shortly to be replaced. I have visited him and thanked him for his time and efforts. It is clear to me that his involvement has re-generated the shop; so, in formal recognition, "Thank you Jack."

A recent charitable event took place at Stenbury Hall on Saturday the 3rd May when I hosted a pub quiz in aid of the Ukrainian appeal. We managed to raise several hundred pounds and I found it very humbling that a little village like ours can pull together for people thousands of miles away. We, together with Holy Trinity Church in Bembridge, contributed towards the funeral costs of a victim, Michael, a resident of Kherson, killed in a drone attack. I sincerely thank Jan Dyer for everything that she did.

My role as Chairman is many and varied. I am due to attend a Highways meeting which I will report on next month, to discuss the condition of the main road - a subject which prompts much discussion. The Wroxall Minibus Association is being wound down and legal advice is being sought to confirm what may be done with the funds that remain. I recently had the privilege of presenting the pupils of our school with mugs that they designed to commemorate VE day. The pupils were well informed as to what the celebrations were all about and it was clear to me that they are mindful of the past.

We currently have two vacancies on the Parish Council. If you fancy coming along to a meeting or two to familiarise yourself with what we do, you would be most welcome. At the end of Parish proceedings there is space and time for public questions. We meet on the second Monday of each month - next one June the 9^{th.} You might even want to become involved?

Finally, as we go to print there is one allotment now free. As one looks at them from the 'gates' the top right-hand pitch is available. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you're interested (see email addresses within the back cover). Wishing you all a peaceful, safe, happy and warm summer

*A LOCAL COUNCILLOR MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER AND A British subject or qualifying commonwealth citizen, a citizen of the Republic of Ireland or a citizen of another Member State of the European Community.

He or she must also fulfil at least one of the following criteria:

- 1. During the whole of the 12 months before nomination occupied land or premises as owner or tenant in the parish area or,
- 2. During the same period resided in the Parish, or within 4.8km thereof, or
- 3. During the same period had her/his principle or only place of work in the Parish, or
- 4. At the time of nomination be registered as a local government elector for the administration area of the Parish.

The person should not be disqualified from being elected by reason of any disqualification set out in Section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972, or any decision made under section 79 of the Local Government Act 2000






We have had a fabulous few weeks in school. The sun is shining which makes everyone feel a bit brighter and it has been wonderful to see lots more outdoor learning happening across







A great result.


Hopefully, young swifts will investigate and stay, or return to claim the boxes for breeding next year.

Swifts are rapidly running out of spaces to raise their young as buildings are renovated and effectively sealed up. New builds can easily, and cheaply, incorporate 'Swift bricks' that include self contained nest spaces.

Many thanks to Mark and Richard Larter for all their hard work making, and then custom- fitting the four nest boxes behind the louvres, whist squeezing themselves into such a small space!

Should anyone be interested in helping the Island's declining Swift population by providing them with a specially designed Swift nestbox, please contact the IW Swift Box Scheme at iwswifts@gmail.com. The boxes need to be placed under overhanging eaves at least 4.5 metres (15 feet) up a wall with no obstacles immediately below such as lower buildings. The cost of each box includes installation.


