Chairmans Report

Dear residents.

The recent elections to select a new Councillor for the wards of Lowtherville, Upper Ventnor and Wroxall have taken place. The successful candidate was Mr Mark Jefferies who secured something approaching 48% of the vote. I would personally like to offer my congratulations to him. He has immersed himself in village life for several years now. He attends virtually every Parish Council meeting and I know he

was the candidate of choice of the out-going Councillor, Rodney Downer. Mark recently helped with one of the two BBQs for the Garage Gallop in June and I am quite sure he will continue to be a great asset to the village.

For his part Rodney and Adrian Gallop (who retired from the Parish Council in May) were honoured recently in a tribute evening at Stenbury Hall. There was a band, The Hillmans, which included Mick Taylor, a founding member of the Rolling Stones. There were a few short speeches and plaudits a-plenty. In a final word thank you both for all your service to the village for what amounts to almost 50 years.

The Parish Council are volunteers. We aim to assist the residents and have a little money that we can distribute to organisations in the village that may help continue their services. The assigning of funds has just taken place for 2025 and will be available to read in the minutes published each month on-line and posted in the notice board opposite the old Worsley site. Despite our best efforts though, sometimes we cannot assist. The matter is perhaps for the Police or the Council to deal with but if we can signpost any issue that you may have, please contact us.

I run a small quiz night on the last Wednesday of each month at Stenbury Hall and it was my honour to be asked to be a quizmaster for a one-off event to raise funds for our school on the 12th July. There were about 30 quizzers and we raised £130. This will go towards some new books which the children earn when they achieve milestones dojo points - for every 100 dojos they win a book. Any congratulations should go to John and Jess Steele who organised the event, bought the raffle prizes and ran the bar on the night. My thanks to you both. Finally, the Wildflowers in the Rec haven't really emerged. A few have poked their flowering heads about the Rye grass have but they are few and far between. 



This week Reception class have enjoyed a beach trip,







Island residents are being invited to take part in a region-wide survey that will help shape the future of local government across the region.

The Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) survey — now live — gives everyone the chance to share their views on how councils could be restructured to better serve local communities.

The Isle of Wight Council is working in partnership with councils across Hampshire, Portsmouth, and Southampton to explore changes to the current system.

While most of Hampshire operates under a two-tier structure — with services split between county and district or borough councils — the Isle of Wight already functions as a unitary authority, delivering all local services directly.

Under the proposals being considered, the Isle of Wight would remain a unitary authority. Meanwhile, the mainland councils are exploring the creation of four new unitary councils to replace the existing 15-council structure

This joint survey marks the next phase of the LGR process, following the submission of an interim plan for change earlier this year.

It focuses on gathering feedback from across the area, with a particular emphasis on local community identity.

Island residents are being encouraged to take part and make their voices heard before 27 July 2025.






